Update from the December Parish Council Meeting

The Parish Council considered a report produced after the meeting with the Highways Engineer which discussed options for traffic management within the village. All options required a costly feasibility study and, in conjunction with a review of data from the SAM2, were unlikely to succeed. Councillors decided that the cost was too great at this time. The full report is on the website or available from the Clerk.

2025-26 Budget and Parish Precept

Councillors discussed their responsibilities to ensure that finances are in a sound position to meet anticipated costs which previous precept rises have not achieved. They also considered a grant request for Churchyard maintenance and Approved a grant amounting to 50% of Churchyard costs for the coming year. This resulted in a precept request for the 2025 – 26 Financial Year of £6,600: an <u>annual increase</u> of £17.10 for Council Tax Band D payers (less for those on Bands A to C and more for those on higher bands). This equates to 32.6%.

The Parish Council is responsible for maintenance and replacement of village assets such as the Speed Awareness Sign, Noticeboard and Telephone Box and looking after the Common amongst other things. Councillors also represent the views of the Civil Parish to higher tiers of Government.

Everyone is welcome at ALL Parish Council meetings – the next meeting is planned to take place on Wednesday 12th March, 6.30pm in All Saints Church. There is always an opportunity to ask questions or express concerns.

Thornage Common

The fruit trees on the Common have been pruned and are looking in good health.

The Cherry tree on the little common across the road is dying and will be removed in the near future. Let the Council know if you have a preference on a replacement tree.

Defibrillator Training

We are collaborating with a neighbouring Parish Council to try to offer a training session for village residents covering general CPR (Cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and how to use a defibrillator. It is likely to take place in Hindringham Village Hall and there will be a small charge of £5 per person. It would be helpful to determine levels of interest if it goes ahead.
